Leadership Michigan is designed for current and future leaders to encounter first-hand the critical issues facing Michigan. Each session includes leadership development, networking, experiential learning, and discussion components that bring each topic alive.

The program works to accomplish several goals:

- * To inspire leaders to become active in organization, community, or statewide efforts that make Michigan a better place to work and live
- * To challenge leaders to increase their awareness about themselves and their state and to maximize their leadership potential
- * To provide an opportunity to network with a variety of individuals to strengthen personal and organizational clout.
