The Michigan Chamber has already begun to review the Court's ruling in *South Dakota v. Wayfair*.



"As a statewide business organization representing over 6,000 businesses that employ over 1.2 million Michiganders, the Michigan Chamber will be working with member businesses across the state to assess this ruling that overturns a decades-old precedent," said Dan Papineau, Director of Tax Policy & Regulatory Affairs for the Michigan Chamber.

"Commerce in Michigan is different today than it was even just 20 years ago," noted Papineau. "As the state's economy evolves, it is reasonable to believe a review of Michigan tax laws would be necessary."

"As Michigan's largest, most-effective business advocacy organization, the Michigan Chamber will play a leadership role in forthcoming discussions on potential changes to Michigan's Sales Tax statutes."
